AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A right leg minus the foot and a left thigh bone, all the tissues completely skeletonized.

From anthropology examination, the remains were from an adult person i.e. over 17, though it was not possible to say whether male or female. He or she measured from 168 to 184 cms in height.

There was a probable gunshot injury to the right thigh, fragmenting the lower half of the femur and with the core of a bullet found with the bones. There were also fractures of both lower leg bones, but parts were missing and it was not possible to say what caused these or whether they occurred before or after death.

While a gunshot wound to the leg could prove fatal if untreated, the absence of the rest of the body makes it difficult to say that this was the cause of death and so the cause is best left as unascertained.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 162BP** was:
Unascertained
