AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

A largely complete body minus the skull, the first two cervical vertebrae, few ribs and few bones from both hands. There was a substantial amount of soft tissue adherent.

The person was male as judged from soft tissue evidence, and as estimated from anthropological data was aged between 30 and 60 years and measured from 181 to 197 cm (mean: 189 cm) in height.

There was the core of a bullet lodged within the soft tissue of the right side of the thorax, but there were no obvious gunshot wounds to the bones. Although with such a gunshot injury to the thorax, it is highly likely that there would have been associated internal damage or complications, this cannot be definitely proved and so the cause of death must remain unascertained.

The fractures of the right scapula, and of several ribs of both sides, probably were caused by post mortem influence.

Together with the bones of both hands several pieces of a ligature was in a plastic bag, as collected from the site.

There were no other injuries nor other findings.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 168B was:

Unascertained
