## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## **SUMMARY:**

A complete body, with partly mummified skin still on the trunk and legs and a substantial amount of soft tissue beneath. The rest of the body was partly skeletonized, with the head and forearms disarticulated.

The person was male, and as established from anthropology data was aged between 25 and 45, and measured from 167 to 182 cm in height. There were no particularly identifying features.

He would appear to have died from a gunshot wound to the chest, which had shattered the inner end of the left collarbone and probably damaged the heart and lungs. He had also been shot through the left leg, shattering the lower end of the femur. Presumably the latter occurred first.

There were fractures of the lower jaw, of several ribs on the right side of the chest, of the left shoulder blade and of a number of vertebrae in the spine, but these probably all occurred post mortem due to crushing of the body.

When found, there was clothing on the lower half of his body but not on the upper half, and his hands were tied behind his back by a cloth ligature around his wrists.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 179B was:

Gunshot wound to chest
