AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A complete body except for a few small bones of both hands and feet. The body was almost completely skeletonized with a little mummified tissue attached. There was a ligature around the bones of the right hand.

From anthropology data, the body was of a male whose age ranged between 31 - 71 and stature estimated as 185.0 + 1.7.7 cm. There were no specific identifying features.

There were multiple gunshot injuries to the right pelvic area and the right thigh as was shown by the multiple fragmented fractures of the bones of those areas, the recovered bullets from the body and the radiological diagnosis. There was also a gunshot injury to both hands as shown by the fragmented fractures of their bones. Since there was a ligature around the bones of the right hand it is most likely that the bound hands were shot by the same missile.

It was not possible to confirm if the fractured right scapula, right ulna and left fibula were ante or post mortem in nature.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 475B was:

Gunshot injuries to the pelvis and lower limbs

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
