SUMMARY:

A large collection of bones from all parts of the body, from at least four different individuals. There was no soft tissue surviving.

As established from anthropology examination, two of the individuals were adult and two were young persons, below the age of 23. Of all the bones it was only possible to say that one was definitely male; with all the others it was not possible to say one way or the other. There were no particular identifying features.

There were fractures of a skull, several ribs, one of the bones of the spine and a number of arm and leg bones, but none of the fractures showed any specific features, in particular no evidence of gunshot damage, and it is therefore difficult to say what caused most of them or whether they occurred before of after death.

From this examination it is thus not possible to determine the cause of death in any of these individuals.
