#### SUMMARY:

A large collection of bones from all parts of the body, from at least four individuals. There was no soft tissue surviving.

As established from anthropology examination, two of the individuals were adults while the other two were young persons, including one or more under the age of 17. Only with a few bones was it possible to say that the person was male: with the majority, it was not possible to say one way or the other. There were no other particular identifying features.

There were fractures of several of the bones present, with fragments missing. Some, such as fractures of a number of ribs and of part of a pelvis, were almost certainly caused after death from crushing of the body. With others, including fractures of a number of skulls and of several arm and leg bones, it was not possible to say what caused them or if they occurred before or after death.

In only one bone, one of the skulls, was there evidence of a definite gunshot injury, with a bullet entrance hole. In this individual, at least, it can be assumed that this was the cause of death.

#### CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL02 011BP General Body Parts** was:

- 1. Gunshot injury of head
- 2. Unascertained
