SUMMARY:

A collection of bones including a piece of skull, a few ribs, the right shoulder blade, the right arm and the pelvis, with no soft tissues surviving.

From anthropology examination some of the bones were from a young male person i.e. someone aged between 15 and 23, but the right arm and shoulder blade appeared to be from someone else, someone older. There were no other identifying features.

The skull was clearly fragmented but as only a small portion was remaining at the front, it was not possible to say what caused this or whether even it occurred before or after death. There were also fractures of some left ribs and of the apparently separate shoulder blade and arm bones, but these may well have occurred after death from crushing or moving of the body.

There were no other findings and from this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.
