## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

GLOGOVA GRAVE SITE

### **SUMMARY:**

The upper part of a trunk together with parts of a skull and a right forearm bone. There was a substantial amount of greasy tissue still attached.

From anthropology examination the remains were from an adult, from someone over the age of 24, but it was not possible to say whether male or female or to determine anything further.

There were fractures of the skull, left collarbone and of numerous ribs, and although possible bullet fragments were seen in the remains, it was not possible to detect any specific bullet injuries in any of the fragments, nor even to say whether all or some of the fractures occurred before or after death.

From this examination therefore, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL02 023BP** was:
