SUMMARY:

Parts of a body only, including the skull, neck bones, right shoulder, and some ribs, the remains being completely skeletonized.

From anthropology estimation, the person was male and adult i.e. over 17, but it was not possible to determine anything further.

There was evidence of a gunshot wound to the shoulder, fragmenting the upper part of the arm bone and the collarbone, and with an intact bullet lying alongside. There was possibly associated damage to three of the bones in the neck.

While this injury could have proved fatal, it would be difficult to prove this completely, and with the absence of the rest of the body, it is better to leave the cause of death of this person as unascertained.

There were no other significant findings.
