SUMMARY:

A large collection of individual bones from all parts of the body, from at least seven different persons. There were no soft tissues surviving.

As established from anthropology examination, five of the individuals were adult and two were young persons i.e. under the age of 17. With only one bone was it possible however, to say that the person was male, with the others it was not possible to establish whether they were male or female.

Many of the bones were fractured but there were no specific features to these, with no clear evidence of any gunshot defects. Some were undoubtedly post mortem in nature, from crushing or moving the bodies, but with the majority it was difficult to say what caused them or whether they occurred before or after death.

The only other findings were evidence of burning of some of the clothing mixed in with the remains and a pressure bandage also included, suggestive perhaps of an earlier injury suffered by one of the individuals.

From this examination it is not possible to establish the cause of death in these persons.
