SUMMARY:

A complete and intact skull with part of the lower jaw and the upper few bones of the neck. There were no soft tissues surviving apart from the brain inside the skull.

From anthropology examination, the remains were from a male adult i.e. someone over the age of 17, but it was not possible to determine anything further.

The lower jaw was fractured and half of it missing but this probably occurred after death from moving of the body.

There were no other findings and from this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.
