## AUTOPSY REPORT

GLOGOVA GRAVE SITE

### **SUMMARY:**

A large part of a body, but minus the head and arms, apart from the right upper arm. The remains were completely skeletonized, with no soft tissue remaining whatever.

From anthropology estimation, the person was male, aged between 31 and 71, and measured from 167 to 183 cm in height. There were no other identifying features.

There was evidence of a possible gunshot injury or injuries to the chest, with fragmentation of the left collarbone and damage to a number of ribs on both sides, but it was difficult to be conclusive about this.

There were additional rib fractures, and fractures of both sides of the pelvis, but these are likely to have been post mortem injuries from crushing or moving the body. There was also a fracture of one of the bones of the left leg below the knee, but it was not possible to say what caused this or whether it occurred before or after death.

There were no other significant findings. Given the above uncertainties about the injuries, the cause of death in this person, from this examination, is best left as unascertained.

3. Ribs: right – fractures
