SUMMARY:

Bones from the left side of the chest and the left upper arm, the remains being completely skeletonized.

From anthropology examination they were from an adult aged between 22 and 63, but it was not possible to say whether male or female or to determine anything further.

A number of the ribs were fractured, at various sites, but what caused these or whether they occurred before or after death is difficult to say. There was no clear evidence of gunshot damage in any of the fragments. The only other injury was a fracture of the left shoulder blade but most likely this did occur after death from crushing or moving of the body.

There were no other findings, and from this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.
