SUMMARY:

Part of a body only – the spine, some ribs, the pelvis and both legs – the remains being largely skeletonized with only a little soft material adherent

From anthropology estimation, the person was male, aged between 25 and 60, and measured from 169 to 185 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

There were fractures of a number of ribs on both sides of the chest, which probably occurred in life. They had no particular features of gunshot injury however, and more likely were due to blunt force trauma such as kicking or blows from a weapon. It is not possible however, to completely exclude them having occurred after death, from crushing or moving the body.

The only other injuries were a fracture of the left lower leg bones above the ankle. Again, it was not possible to say whether these occurred before or after death.

There were no other significant findings and so from this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.
