SUMMARY:

These were the remains of an almost skeletonized body. The left limbs were partially missing as well as the lower half of the right arm. The skull was shattered.

From the anthropological data, the person was male, aged between 31 and 65 years old and measured 172.7 +/- 7.7 cm in height.

The autopsy reveals that the man was shot at least twice. A bullet appears to have passed through the head, in the sagittal plane, striking the upper cervical vertebrae, the cranial base and the mandible. Another bullet struck the upper side of the thorax, fracturing the 3rd right rib and the 1st, 2nd and 3rd thoracic vertebrae.

The man died from the injuries he received.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL02 105B** was:
Firearm injuries to the head and trunk.

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.

Head and Neck:

1. The skull was shattered. After reconstruction no entry or exit holes could be found. The focus of the shot seems to be in the cranial base, involving the facial bones. Large part of the facial bone and cranial base was missing. ✓
2. The right ramus of the mandible was fractured. The fracture line was longitudinal starting from the molars alveoli. ✓
3. The 1st and 2nd cervical vertebra were deeply fractured. ✓

Trunk:

4. The 1st and 2nd cervical vertebra were fractured. ✓
5. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd thoracic vertebrae were deeply fractured in comminuted pieces. ✓
6. The 3rd right rib head was fractured and missing. ✓
7. The 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, and 10th right ribs were fracture on the emiclavear line. ✓

8. "Sub capite" fracture of the left humerus: the fracture rim was slopping to the bottom, medial to lateral oriented.
