SUMMARY:

Most of the lower part of a body – the left side of the pelvis and both legs, still with a substantial amount of soft tissue surviving including some skin on the feet.

From anthropology examination the remains were from an adult male, aged between 17 and 71, and measuring from 170 to 185 cms in height.

There were no injuries, and from this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person. The only other finding was what may have been very occasional shotgun pellets with the remains.

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL02 108BP** was:
Unascertained
