SUMMARY:

Parts of a skull and lower jaw, together with a single bone from a foot.

From anthropology examination the remains were from a male adult i.e. someone over the age of 17, but it was not possible to say whether male or female or to determine anything further.

The skull was extensively fractured and large pieces missing. There were no obvious gunshot holes in the parts remaining and it is thus difficult to say what caused the injury or whether it occurred before or after death. The lower jaw was also fractured but most likely this did occur after death from crushing or moving of the body.

There were no other findings and from this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.
