These are the skeletonized remains of a man. His age is estimate between 25 and 60, and stature is 178.7 +/- 7.7 cms.

Several bones are missing, particularly the head, and there is no evidence of a lethal injury. The observation of metallic pieces of bullet in the trunk area are nevertheless suggestive of the cause of death.
