SUMMARY:

A small collection of assorted bones including skull, ribs and limb bones. There was no soft tissue surviving.

As established from anthropology examination, they were from at least two individuals, one of them adult, the other younger i.e. under 17, but it was not possible with any of them to say whether they were male or female or to determine anything further.

The skull or skulls were clearly fragmented but there were no specific features such as gunshot injury, and it is thus difficult to say what caused the damage or whether it occurred before or after death. A fracture of the lower jaw present looked very much like a post mortem injury.

There were no other significant findings, and from this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in these persons.
