SUMMARY:

Both forearms and hands, together with the lower half of the left upper arm, the tissues being completely skeletonized.

From anthropology examination the remains were from an adult i.e. someone over 17 but it was not possible to say whether male or female or to determine anything further.

The upper arm bone was fractured in its middle part but there were no particular features of the injury and it was difficult therefore to establish what caused it or to say whether it occurred before or after death.

There were no other findings and from this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL03 006BP** was:
Unascertained
