SUMMARY:

A left foot in a boot, with part of the lower leg still attached, plus a single bone from the other foot. Most of the skin and soft tissues were still present apart from in the lower leg where the bones were skeletonized.

From anthropology examination the remains were from an adult, aged over 17, but it was not possible to say whether male or female or to determine anything further.

The lower leg bones were fractured in their middle parts but almost certainly this occurred after death from moving of the body.

There were no other injuries and from this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.
