AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

An assortment of individual bones from all parts of the body, with no soft tissue surviving.

As established from anthropology examination, they were from least four different persons, three of them adult and one younger i.e. under 17. The two pelvic bones present were both male but with the other bones it was not possible to say whether they were male or female.

Many of the bones were fractured, including the four skulls present and several arm and leg bones. None of the fractures showed any specific features such as gunshot injury and it was difficult to say what caused them or whether they occurred before or after death. Fractures of several ribs present and of one of the pelvic bones most likely did occur after death from crushing or moving of the body.

One of the fractured bones was a left shin bone. The various fragments showed evidence of burning, some of them being charred. Most likely this was burning of already fractured and skeletonized remains, and thus was some considerable time after death.

From this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in any of these persons.
