AUTOPSY REPORT

GLOGOVA GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

Numerous bones from at least six separate individuals, from all parts of the body. There was no soft tissue surviving.

As established from anthropology examination, the individuals were all adults, i.e. over 17, but it was not possible with any of them to say whether they were male or female.

Each of the 6 skulls present was fractured and many parts missing. None of them showed any specific features however, such as gunshot damage, and so it was difficult to say what caused the injuries or whether they occurred before or after death. The same applied to fractures of several arm and leg bones.

The only other injury was evidence of burning of a number of ankle bones, almost certainly after death.

There were no other significant findings and from this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in any of these persons,
