SUMMARY:

A more or less complete body apart from occasional bones from the chest and spine and the right hand and foot. The remains were skeletonized but with some greasy material still attached to the bones.

As established from anthropology examination, the person was a young man, aged between 15 and 20, and measuring from 170 to 186 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

There was evidence of a possible gunshot injury to the trunk, fracturing one of the bones of the spine, but there were no bullet fragments remaining and it was difficult to be definite about this. There was an almost certain gunshot injury however, to his left forearm, passing between both bones, and with a distorted bullet found close by.

There were no other injuries or significant findings, apart from evidence of burning of his clothing. On account of the doubts about the shot to the trunk, it is probably best to leave the cause of death, from this examination, as unascertained.
