SUMMARY:

A complete body apart from occasional ribs and a few small bones from the hands and feet. The remains were completely skeletonized, with only greasy material adherent to the bones.

As established from anthropology examination, the person was male, aged between 31 and 65, and measured from 164 to 180 cms in height. The only additional identifying feature was evidence of an old fracture of his right wrist.

He died probably from a gunshot injury to the chest which had fractured a number of bones in the spine and the attached ribs on both sides, albeit with no bullet fragments. There were additional fractures of three ribs at the front of the left side of the chest which may have been related.

The only other injuries were fractures of the left shoulder blade, the left upper arm and one of the bones of the left forearm, but it was not possible to say what caused these or whether they occurred before or after death.

There were no other significant findings.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number GL05 023B was:

Gunshot injury to chest
