## AUTOPSY REPORT

#### SUMMARY:

A largely complete body but missing the head, most of both lower legs and the right foot. There were additional rib and shoulder blade fragments from another person mixed in.

As established from anthropology examination the person was male, aged between 31 and 65 and measured from 172 to 188 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

There was evidence of a probable gunshot injury to the chest, suggested by fragmentation of the spine in two places and fractures of four ribs on the left side. No bullet fragments were recovered however, to confirm this one way or the other.

The only other injuries were additional rib fractures and a fracture of the upper end of the right shin bone, but it was difficult to know what caused these or whether they occurred before or after death. Apart from evidence of burning of the clothing, there were no other significant findings.

With the absence of the head and the doubts about the chest injury, it is best to regard the cause of death in this person as unascertained.
