**AUTOPSY REPORT**  
GLOGOVA GRAVE SITE

**SUMMARY:**

A largely complete body but missing a few bones from the neck, both hands and the left lower leg and foot. The remains were totally skeletonized, with only muddy material still attached.

As established from anthropology examination, the person was male, aged between 31 and 60 and measured from 173 to 189 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

The skull was extensively fractured, but as much of it was missing and there were no particular features in the portions remaining, it was not possible to say what caused the damage or whether it occurred before or after death. Similarly, there were fractures of the left shoulder blade and of a number of ribs on the left side of the chest, which may have been genuine injuries or damage caused post mortem from crushing or moving of the body.

There were no other significant findings and from this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person,
