AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

A substantially complete body but missing the head, the left arm, the right hand and occasional bones from elsewhere. The remains were totally skeletonized with no soft tissue remaining.

As established from anthropology examination the person was a young male aged between 15 and 21 and measuring from 168 to 184 cms in height. There were no other identifying features.

The only injuries present were fractured ribs on both sides of the chest and fractures of the left shoulder blade. Some of these appeared to be damage caused after death from crushing or moving of the body, and with the others it was not possible to say one way or the other i.e. caused before or after death. None of them showed any specific features such as gunshot injury.

The only other finding was evidence of burning of some of his clothing.

From this examination, and with significant parts of the body missing, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL05 058(i) B** was: **Unascertained**


