SUMMARY:

Most of the upper half of a body but missing the right hand, the pelvis and a few bones of the spine. The remains were totally skeletonized.

As established from anthropology examination, the person was a young man, aged between 14 and 23. There were, however, no other identifying features.

There was evidence of a probable gunshot wound to the chest, fracturing two of the bones in the middle of the back and possibly one of the ribs on the left side. There was additional damage to two of the bones in the lower part of the spine which <u>may</u> have been a further gunshot injury, but alternatively may have occurred after death in moving of the body, particularly given that the lower half of it was missing.

There were no other injuries and no other significant findings, other than evidence of burning of his clothing.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL05 067B** was:

Gunshot injury to trunk
