SUMMARY:

A complete and intact skull including the lower jaw, with no soft tissues attached. There was also a single finger bone included, whether or not from the same person.

As established from anthropology examination the skull was from a young person, aged between 14 and 17, but there were no other identifying features.

There were no injuries to the skull, though the single finger bone was broken.

There were no other findings and from this examination it is not possible to establish the cause of death in this person.
