AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

Parts of the upper half of a body – the head and neck, the left arm and shoulder and a single rib – all completely skeletonized.

From anthropology examination they were from a young man aged between 19 and 29, but there were no other particular identifying features.

There were fractures of the face and of two of the bones in the neck, but most likely these occurred after death from crushing or moving of the body.

There were no other significant findings, and from this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.
