AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

A complete body with an additional left hand from another person mixed in. The remains were totally skeletonized though with some greasy material still adherent.

As established from anthropology examination the person was male, aged between 31 and 60, and measured from 170 to 186 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

He would appear to have died from one or more gunshot injuries to the chest which had passed through the right collarbone and first rib, and damaged several bones in the middle of the spine and the ribs attached to them. Several small bullet fragments were seen in the area.

The only other injuries were a few additional fractured ribs on each side of the chest which may or may not have occurred before death, and fractures of both bones of the right forearm which most likely were post mortem injuries from crushing or moving of the body.

Apart from evidence of burning of his upper clothing, there were no other significant findings.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL05 082B** was:
Gunshot injury to chest

 - additional disruption of left half of body of T10
 - fractures of left 5th, 6th and 7th ribs at spine

3. Ribs left: fractures of 8 and 9 in posterior axillary line ✓
