SUMMARY:

An almost complete, skeletonized and diarticulated, body with muddy tissues adherent.

As established from anthropology examination, the person was male, aged between 17 and 23 years old, and measured from 169 to 183 cm in height. There were no particular identifying features.

The fractures of the inner part of the left clavicle and of the distal portion of the left cubitus, with an oval shape could be consistent with gunshot injuries.

In the absence of other evidence, no cause of death was found.
