AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

An almost complete, dislocated and skeletonized body, missing the left hand and small bones of the right hand and feet.

As established from anthropology examination, the person was male, aged between 17 and 23, and measured from 174 to 189 cm in height. There were no other particular identifying features.

He died from a gunshot wound to the head in the left occipito-parietal region. The exit was probably through the bones of the face.

Probably another gunshot wound occurred at the right forearm with a fracture of the right radius.

Elsewhere, there were fractures of the left 4th rib and the middle part of the right humerus, but it was difficult to say what caused them or whether even they occurred before or after death.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL05 119B** was:
Gunshot wound of the head
