**SUMMARY:**

Most of the upper half of a body minus the head and the left arm. A left hand was present but it was not certain that it definitely belonged to this person. The remains were largely skeletonized, with only greasy material adherent in some areas.

From anthropology examination the person was a young adult, aged between 22 and 35, but it was not possible to say whether male or female or to determine anything further.

The only injuries present were three fractured ribs – two on the left side and one on the right – but it was difficult to say what caused these or to decide even if they occurred before or after death. This was despite the presence of small metal fragments throughout the remains.

Apart from evidence of burning of his clothing, which presumably occurred after death, there were no other significant findings.

From this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.
