SUMMARY:

The lower half of a body – the lower end of the spine, the pelvis and both legs, still with soft tissue attached in many places.

From anthropology examination, the remains were from a young man aged between 17 and 25, who measured from 167 to 183 cms in height.

There were no injuries and, apart from evidence of burning of his clothing, no other significant findings. From this examination therefore, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL05 121(ii) BP** was:
Unascertained
