AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

A largely complete body but missing the head, the top four bones of the spine, some ribs and the right foot. There were additional right and left hand bones from another person mixed in. The remains were completely skeletonized, with no soft tissue surviving.

As established from anthropology examination the person was male, aged between 22 and 55 and measured from 170 to 186 cms in height. Clearly at some time in the past he had broken his left shin, the fractured bone ends having joined together to leave an obvious deformity of the leg.

He died from a gunshot wound to the chest, as seen by a clear bullet hole in one of the ribs at the back of the left side of the chest and fragmentation of three vertebrae in the middle of the spine. There were no bullet fragments left behind.

There were no other injuries or significant findings, apart from evidence of extensive burning of all of his clothing, mostly on the back.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL05 124B** was: **Gunshot wound of chest**
