SUMMARY:

An almost complete, disarticulated body, in clothing, with muddy material adherent.

As established from anthropology examination, the person was male, aged between 31 and 71, and measured from 165 to 179 cm in height. There were no other identifying features.

He died probably from a gunshot injury of the chest which had fragmented several bones of the spine (7th to 11th thoracic vertebrae). A fracture had also been found of the left maxilla with a jacketed bullet adjacent. The fractures of the right metacarpal bones could be related to a gunshot injury.

The clothes showed evidence of burning which probably occurred after death.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL05 126B** was: **Gunshot injury to the chest**
