A complete and intact skull including the lower jaw and the top three bones in the spine. There were an additional two hand bones from another, much younger, person mixed in.

From anthropology examination the remains were from a male adult over the age of 17, the only other identifying feature being that he had an upper denture in his mouth, pointing to a somewhat older individual.

There were no fractures or any other injuries, and from this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.
