SUMMARY:

A complete body minus the left shoulder blade, the left hand and both feet. The remains were skeletonized apart from greasy soft material still present on the bones.

As established from anthropology examination the person was male, aged between 31 and 50, and measured from 162 to 178 cms in height. There were no other particular identifying features.

He died from a gunshot injury to the head, the bullet probably entering in the middle of the back of the head and exiting through the right side of the top. There was probably an additional shot to the chest, fracturing two of the bones in the spine.

Other injuries included fractured ribs on both sides of the chest, some of which probably occurred after death from crushing of the body, but some of which were difficult to decide on one way or the other. Both lower legs appeared to have been sheared off below the knees, this almost certainly being post mortem damage caused in moving the body. The fractured bone ends showed signs of burning, which clearly must therefore have occurred after the lower parts of the legs had come off. Some of his clothing was also burnt, particularly his track suit trousers.

There were no other significant findings.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL05 140B** was:

Gunshot injuries to head and chest
