## AUTOPSY REPORT

GLOGOVA GRAVE SITE

### SUMMARY:

An almost complete, skeletonized and disarticulated body.

As established from anthropology examination, the person was male, aged between 15 and 22, and measured from 173 to 187 cm in height. There were no other particular identifying features.

He died from a gunshot wound to the head which had caused extensive fragmentation of the skull. The entrance hole is situated in the paramedian left part of the occipital and the exit should have been at the right part of the face. The bones of the right part of the face were missing.

Elsewhere, there were fractures of the left 3<sup>rd</sup> rib, and of the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> thoracic vertebrae. The bodies of these vertebrae were split. Therefore, it could be assumed that gunshot wounds of the trunk occurred.

### CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL05 143B** was:  
**Gunshot wound of head**
