SUMMARY:

An almost complete body apart from some of the small bones of the hands. The remains were skeletonized apart from some greasy material still attached.

As established from anthropology examination, the person was male, aged between 25 and 55 and measured from 172 to 188 cms in height. There were no other particular identifying features.

He died from a gunshot injury or injuries to the chest, with evidence of a bullet having passed through the left collarbone and two of the adjacent ribs, and clear evidence also of a bullet hole in one of the lower ribs at the back of the right side of the chest and damage to one of the bones in the middle of the spine. Most likely there were two separate shots. There was a probable third shot to the left shoulder, fragmenting the upper arm bone and with bullet fragments left behind.

There were no other injuries or significant findings.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL05 145B** was:
Gunshot injury to chest
