SUMMARY:

Much of the upper half of a body including the head and the arms but missing near all of the ribs. There was an additional collarbone and various hand bones from another person mixed in. There were no soft tissues surviving.

From anthropology examination the remains were from a male adult, someone over the age of 22, but it was not possible to determine anything further.

The only obvious injury was a fracture of one of the bones in the middle of the spine but with much of the rest of the spine missing it was difficult to say what caused this or to know whether it occurred before or after death. The only other finding was evidence of burning of his clothing.

From this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.
