AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

A largely complete body but missing the head and the right hand. There was still some soft tissue attached in the feet but otherwise the remains were totally skeletonized.

As established from anthropology examination the person was male, aged between 20 to 35 and measuring from 160 to 176 cms in height. There were no other identifying features.

He died from a gunshot injury to the chest which had damaged the right collarbone and adjacent ribs and four bones in the upper part of the spine. Residual bullet fragments were noted in the area. He had also been shot through the right lower leg, most likely from behind, fracturing both bones there.

Apart from a little burning of his outer clothing, there were no other significant findings.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL05 154B** was: **Gunshot injury to chest**
