An almost complete, disarticulated, and skeletonized body, in clothing.

As established from anthropology examination, the person was male, aged between 15 and 19 and measured from 171 to 185 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

The investigations showed fractures with bone defects at the middle part of the left femur and of the distal part of the right humerus.

The shape of these injuries may be consistent with gunshots. In the absence of any injury feature, the cause of death should be considered as unascertained
