SUMMARY:

An almost complete, dislocated and skeletonized body, in clothing, with muddy material adherent.

As established from anthropology examination, the person was male, aged between 19 to 35, and measured from 168 to 182 cms in height. There were no other identifying features.

He died from a gunshot injury to the head and the entrance hole is situated in the paramedian left region of the occipital. The exit might have been at the frontal with fragmentation of this bone.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **GL05 164B** was:
Gunshot injury to the head
